Dear Parent/ Carer,

As we come to the end of the academic year, I would like to thank you all for your continued support and also to congratulate the majority of the students on their excellent standards in academic progress, appearance and behaviour. Please find enclosed your child's report. Please don't hesitate to contact your child's Head of Year if you would like to discuss the report further.

As we move into the new academic year as a new academy, working closely with our outstanding partner, The Heath Family Trust, we have made some positive changes to our expectations as follows:

Every child is expected to be ready to learn and participate and therefore are expected to have the following

Equipment for learning

- A planner (issued to year 7 &8 on the first day or a small notebook to record homework)
- A pencil case containing:

Essential items

2 x pens – black or blue
Green pen for corrections
Pencil
Ruler

Useful items

Highlighter
Calculator

Pencil cases with the items above (minus the calculator and highlighter) can be purchased from either the school office or student support area for £1.00 before school or at break. We expect student to have the essential items when they go to every lesson. Form tutors will check students have equipment with them during form period

Students are responsible for ensuring they know when they have PE and have their PE kit with them on those days.

If students require ingredients for food lessons, they need to ensure they bring them into school on the appropriate day.



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Behaviour

Students are expected to behave in an appropriate manner at all times including to and from school. Their uniform is a signal of their membership of the school community and as such signifies that the behaviour we expect in school should also be present as they travel to and from school. We expect children to be polite and courteous at all times and mindful of their peers, adults and the wider community.

Uniform

All students will be expected to adhere strictly to our uniform policy. Uniform and PE kit can be purchased from Top Form, Sinclair Way, Prescott Business Park (by Spaceworld) or Golden Child, St Mary's Arcade St Helens who stock our school blazers.

All ties must be worn with the top button fastened and blazers must be kept on at all times, unless in extreme weather conditions when this may be relaxed, however the children will be notified accordingly.

Footwear must be all black shoes, **no** canvas shoes, trainers or boots are allowed. If you are unsure, please contact the school for clarification.

Students with hair longer than shoulder length, must tie it back in a neat fashion, large multi coloured bows, headbands and flowers are not allowed. Make up including false eyelashes and false nails are not appropriate for school and should not be worn. Should your child arrive to school with make up on, they will be provided with a face wipe to remove the make up.

Jewellery

Students may wear one pair of stud earrings but no other jewellery is acceptable. Facial piercings of any sort are not acceptable.

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Electrical equipment

Whilst we allow students to have mobile phones in their possession, once they enter the school gates these must be turned off and remain out of sight at all times. Any child found with a mobile phone out in lessons or around school will have it confiscated and a parent or other adult will be required to collect it from the school office. In an emergency, students will be allowed to make a call from school, likewise if you need to speak to your child urgently, a message can be passed to them. No other electrical equipment should be brought into school without express permission.
