2. About this accessibility plan

1. This document should be read in conjunction with The Prescott School's Equality Statement.
2. Everyone at The Prescott School has equal value. The Prescott School's Equality Statement is based on the principle of respect for each individual. The Heath School is committed to taking positive action in the spirit of the Equality Act 2010 and all members of The Prescott School are committed to developing a culture of inclusion, support and awareness within The Prescott School so that each individual can grow and flourish regardless of Sex, Race, Religion Faith or Belief, Disability, Age, Sexual Orientation, Age, Gender Re-assignment, Marriage and Civil Partnership and Pregnancy and Maternity (the Protected Characteristics).
3. This accessibility plan will be reviewed every 3 years.

3. Objectives

1. The key objectives of The Prescott School's accessibility plan is to reduce and eliminate any barriers to access the curriculum and to full participation in The Prescott School community for current pupils and prospective pupils with a disability and to help provide a safe, caring and friendly environment for all members of The Prescott School. In particular, this Accessibility Plan sets out the proposals of how The Prescott School intends to increase access to education for pupils with disabilities in three key areas, as follows:
 1. promoting opportunities for pupils with disabilities to participate in The Prescott School curriculum;
 2. developing the physical environment of The Prescott School to ensure that pupils with disabilities can take advantage of education and associated services; and,
 3. ensuring that information is provided in the appropriate formats for pupils with disabilities, staff, parents and visitors so that they are not disadvantaged.
